# Weathernews Provides Weather Support for 2016 Red Bull Air Race Chiba Go/No-Go Decision Support for the World's Fastest Motor Sport at 370km/h

Weathernews Inc. (Chiba, Japan; CEO: Chihito Kusabiraki) provided weather outlooks for the 2016 Red Bull Air Race held on the weekend of June 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> at Makuhari Beach in Chiba, Japan. Weathernews provided weather information to the Red Bull Air Race Committee during their planning stages to help set the venue and timing of the event. In addition, on the days of the race itself, the Weathernews Sports Weather Team also provided Go/No-Go decision support on whether or not the races could be safely held. Weathernews will continue to provide weather support to Red Bull Japan in the planning, operation and decision making of their various events.

#### Weather Support for the 2016 Red Bull Air Race

Starting a year before the event, Weathernews studied the meteorological characteristics of the proposed venue, including wind, waves, start of the rainy season and the risk of tropical cyclones, and the results of this analysis were used in determining the ideal timing of the races. A week before the event, information such as weather, temperature, wind and waves was provided and utilized in setting up the course. On the day of the race, the Sports Weather Team provided support from Urayasu Airport on Go/No-Go decisions for the races (including steady flight operations for Medevac helicopters and safety of offshore pylon setting operations) and from Makuhari Kaihin Park to protect the safety of the spectators and the event staff.

#### **Qualifying Race Cancelled Due to Strong Winds and Rough Seas**

The qualifying air race was cancelled\* on Saturday, June 4<sup>th</sup> due to strong winds and rough seas. In order to hold the race, conditions for the safe takeoff and landing of the Medevac helicopters as well as the offshore crews to be able to set up the pylons on the track are necessary. Strong winds were blowing in the morning, and the Weathernews Sports Weather Team predicted the wind to remain strong into the afternoon with rough waves, affecting the safety of the operations. The Red Bull Air Race Japan Committee had determined that the 2.5 meter waves were not suitable for safe

operations, and decided to postpone the qualifying race scheduled for 4:00 PM. The weather was expected to improve by the 5<sup>th</sup> and the finals were held as scheduled.
